HT Report – Focus: School Improvement Plan 23/24

Mrs McGill has given attendees a presentation on the Standards and Quality Report and highlighted - Attendance (22/23 figure: 93.27% with no exclusions), Attainment, Achievements (such as 49 achieving Pope Francis Faith Award 16 with Commendations) and progress in the Improvement plan priorities from last session and the very positive local Authority review undertaken during term 1

Priority 1 Raising Attainment in Reading and Creating a Reading Community

*Achieved Gold Award form Scottish Book Trust Reading Schools Programme. *Every class has reading zone

*Reading Committee created outdoor reading trolley for each area

*S5 / P2 Reading project

*STEM a story approach in partnership with secondary staff for second level – partnership working with Young STEM leaders from HTPS and St. Ninian's *Bedtime Story Club and Family Learning Book Club *Intergenerational reading activities with St. Joseph's Care Home

*Talk for Reading Units developed P1-7 with greater pupil engagement

*Planned 3% increase in Acel data mainly achieved. P1 (+2%), P4 (+17%) P7 (-1.8% but 11% increase on where that cohort tracked previous session.
